t: 0115 854 1313 e: neilb@emfec.co.uk The following information summarises the Job Centre Plus (Central England Group) "State of the Group" Report August 2014 and provides a focus on East Midlands and District level / local authority data.

National data is also covered, providing a context for local employment and skills.

JSA Unemployment (claimant count)

The seasonally adjusted JSA Register (Central England Group) currently stands at 200,200. This is **down 6,600 (3.1%)** from the previous month (July). Claimant count levels are down by 30.4% on this time last year.

Employment Rate

The employment rate for working age people in the UK was 73.0% for the period April to June 2014 (up 0.3% on the previous quarter)

East Midlands: 74.4% (up 1.0% from previous guarter).

Unemployment Rate

The (seasonally adjusted) JSA unemployment rate for the Central England Group is currently 2.5% (compared to 3.6% a year ago).

The ILO Unemployment* rate for the **East Midlands** is 5.4%, (126,000) down 1.4% from the previous quarter.

Vacancies

Around 354,000 new vacancies were received by the Universal Johnatch service during July 2014, **up 35% from the previous month.**

* Unemployment is different from the claimant count, which measures only those people who are claiming unemployment-related benefits (JSA since 1996). The claimant count is normally the lower measure because some unemployed people are not entitled to claim unemployment-related benefits, or choose not to do so.

New JSA Claims (on-flows)

Seasonally adjusted on-flows in the Central England Group from April to June 2014 were 30.4% lower than the corresponding period a year ago.

In the **East Midlands** *unadjusted* on-flows were significantly down on the previous quarter, by 19.5%.

Stopping JSA Claims (off-flows)

Seasonally adjusted off-flow rates in the Central England Group have fallen by 6.9% from the previous quarter (February to April 2014) to 148,100

In the **East Midlands** they have fallen by 9.7% over the same period.

Age and Duration of the Unemployed

The number of people who have been claiming for more than 6 months (Central England Group) has fallen by nearly a third over the past year to 96,900 although it remains 75% above its pre-recession level.

Youth Unemployment

The number of young people (18-24 years old) who have been claiming for more than six months (Central England Group) fell by 1,175 in the last month (July) to 17,745.

In the **East Midlands** the number of young people claiming for more than 6 months has fallen by 47% since July 2013.

Potential redundancies

UK Labour Market, August (ONS)

April to June 2014

- 30.60 million people in work, 167,000 more than for January to March 2014.
- Employment rate of 73%.
- 2.08 million unemployed people, 132,000 fewer than for January to March 2014
- Unemployment rate of 6.4%.
- Pay including bonuses for employees in UKwas 0.2% lower than a year earlier

Regional Labour Market, August (ONS)

April to June 2014

- The largest increase in the employment rate was for the **East Midlands** at 1.0 percentage points (74%). The employment rate in the UK was highest in the South East (76.7%) and lowest in Wales (69.1%).
- The largest decreases in the unemployment rate for the three months to June 2014 compared to the three months to March 2014, were for the **East Midlands** at 1.3 percentage points and the North East at 0.7 percentage points.
